There were also wildlife demonstrations that included an Eagle Owl with orange eyeballs as big as golf balls.






Texas is the only state that has wild ocelots.

This is the original casting for the Monument that now stands in Arlington Cemetery in Washington.

The statue commemorates the flag raising at I wo Jima, Japan

by six American Marines on February 19, 1945.



A recorded message on the path described the history of the statue.





The Memorial is 32 feet high with a 78 foot steel flagpole. The soldiers occupy the same positions as in Rosenthal's historic photograph taken when the flag was erected.
