Saturday April 24, 2010



Tuesday April 27, 2010




Mid afternoon we arrived in Prior Lake and found our way to the Mystic Lake Casino.

Our RV site was between the motel and a bumper car racetrack, which fortunately for us was not open.




This place is probably wild in the summer time, but it was rather deserted when we visited. Across from our place there was an upside down White House complete with an upside down limo.







Down the street was a humungous roller coaster and water slides were around every corner.

Saturday May 1, 2010


