Thursday April 29, 2011

At 5 o'clock Maureen got a cell phone call from Mike's nurse asking why she was not in the room where Mike had been waiting for almost three hours. Too bad that patient confidentiality has made it impossible for nursing staff to keep track of family and friends

Wednesday May 4, 2011

Unfortunately Mike twisted his shoulder getting out of bed. The hip was doing great, but the shoulder caused lots of pain and made it difficult to do his therapy.

Thursday May 5, 2011

Could not find a suitable wheelchair to get Mike into the truck so called for an ambulance to take him the four blocks to St. Marys hospital.

After a long day in emerg he was admitted to a wonderful quiet room at the end of the hall where he got a good night's rest and treatment for his multiple problems.

Tuesday May 10, 2011

Come morning Mike was feeling much better, so Maureen moved him back to Stratford, this time to Anne Hathaway's Retirement home, where an electric hospital bed from Home Health was waiting for him. This was a huge improvement, as Mike had a great private room and the exceptionally helpful staff, including a nurse who lives in Milverton. Now Maureen could get some sleep knowing that Mike was well taken care of.

Wednesday May 11, 2011

Registration Day! The boodle bags were awfully heavy!


Tuesday June 7, 2011

The wood pile is getting lower!






Later in the afternoon it started to rain.
