
Friday February 11, 2011

Maureen brought her reading glasses that have built in lights. Harry got a kick out of reading his menu with them, and Howard had a laugh watching Harry.




After dinner Shawn O`Shea, a Canadian,


entertained us with his musical impressions.



Then we stopped at the piano bar for a martini.








The evening was rounded out with a nightcap at the Skywalker's Lounge.
